


Summary

 - Australia Federal level is stuck




Gas – local, international prices spike





Gas – ACCC netback metric – spike visible, futures well up





Energy policy roundup

- Nothing is likely to be done about gas prices.
 - ACCC Netback Price Series Review
 - User arguments for Henry Hub reference and removal of full cost of export infrastructure
 - Draft decision essentially is for no change
 - Code of Conduct negotiations continue but challenging to alter price outcomes
 - National reservation no word since November 2020
- What else could be done on gas?
- Electricity: Capacity market? Son-of-COGATI?

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Climate policy roundup - Japan


- Japan upgrading energy targets to reflect net zero push
- LNG impact: If met, would halve absolute LNG demand for power by 2030
 - Question mark over new export developments
 - Will prices moderate as supply rebalances?
- Targets are for electricity sector; rest of economy TBA
- H2 impact: If met, would mean power demand for 800kt/yr of H2 or 4Mt/yr of NH3 by 2030
 - That is a lot!
 - Huge for Green H2 projects and/or multiple Blue H2 projects

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Climate policy roundup - EU

- **EU** Commission launched 'Fit for 55' package towards 2030 -55% CO2 goal and net zero 2050
- *many* elements:
 - Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism
 - Strengthen EU ETS, phase out free allocation to EITE covered by CBAM
 - New ETS on fuels for transport and buildings
 - Fuel emissions reductions mandates on international aviation & maritime
- Member States, EU Parliament need to approve.
 New ETS most controversial element. CBAM may be tweaked but likely to get up.





Climate policy roundup - USA

- USA Congress considering two major climate-relevant packages:
 - Bipartisan Infrastructure Framework
 - USD\$1.2 trillion
 - EV charging, bus electrification, transmission, clean finance
 - Partisan Budget Bill / Reconciliation Bill
 - USD \$3.5 trillion
 - Clean Electricity Standard, procurement, tax incentives
 - "Polluter Import Fee" / CBAM
- Passage is <u>not straightforward</u>
- More initiatives coming: emissions regulations, financial reporting



Climate policy roundup - Australia

- Australia under significant pressure to do more on climate
 - G20 called on all members to put forward ambitious commitments by COP26 (November)
 - EU, UK, US coordinating to encourage Australia
- However it seems unlikely much more is coming soon:
 - Crabwalk to Net Zero By 2050 firm commitment has stalled with Nationals
 - No groundwork laid for any other significant changes (2030 targets late run?, implementing policies)
 - No work underway to answer Govt questions about costs of action
 - Long Term Strategy is imminent but likely to simply repackage existing policy
 - Government's Climate Change Coordinator has no policy role, just messaging
 - Possible: more \$ for local and international technology & innovation
